

"God Bless America" is an American patriotic song written by Irving Berlin during World War I in 1918 and revised by him in the run up to World War II in 1938. This simple one-verse song became an overnight hit, and a hopeful song as war threatened. "It's not a patriotic song," composer Irving Berlin said in a 1940 interview, "but an expression of gratitude for what this country has done for its citizens, of what home really means." Today, many Americans consider "God Bless America" an unofficial national anthem of the United States.

Irving Berlin wanted a song that brought Americans together, not set Americans apart. When it came to "God Bless America," he put his money where his mouths was. He donated all the royalties from the hit song to the Boy and Girl Scouts of America through the God Bless America Foundation. That arrangement is still in effect today.

Other wartime songs would remind Americans what they were fighting against. Berlin's "God Bless America" reminded them what they were fighting for.




What's New in Social Ministry
