And be glad in it.



Taking that leap of faith and believing that Jesus rose from the dead, without seeing it for ourselves, brings us to the take-away verse for this lesson, "blessed are those who have not seen me, but still believe!"

The second lesson of the month was on the 4th Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday. In this lesson, centered on John 10:11-18, we explored what it means to celebrate Jesus as our Good Shepherd. We looked at what the attributes of a "good" shepherd are. Words such as nurturing, caring, guiding, and protecting were highlighted. We also acknowledged how we sometimes feel stressed and afraid, just like the lamb in the story who was lost. We noted that ways to handle our stress, such as our faith and prayer, can bring us peace and bring us closer to our loving God. Thank you Good Shepherd!
